Based on the examination of the case and subject to Article 168(3), Article 169 § 3, and Article 170 §§ 1 and 4 of the Constitution, as well as guided by Articles 63 and 64, Article 74 §§ 1-5, and § 6(1) of the Constitutional Law on the Constitutional Court, the Constitutional Court **HOLDS**:

1. The obligations prescribed by the Rome Statute of the International Criminal Court signed on July 17, 1998, and by the statement on retroactive recognition of the jurisdiction of the International Criminal Court based on article 12, paragraph 3 of the Rome Statute of the International Criminal Court comply with the Constitution.

2. Pursuant to Article 170 § 2 of the Constitution, this Decision shall be final and shall enter into force upon its promulgation.
